**08262** shaqats, shaw-kats' a primitive root; to be filthy, i.e. (intensively) to loathe, pollute:--abhor, make abominable, have in abomination, detest, X utterly.

**Maketh Desolate:** 0807 shamem, shaw-mame' a primitive root; to stun (or intransitively, grow numb), i.e. devastator (figuratively) stupefy...make amazed, be astonied, (be an) astonish(-ment), (...make) desolate(-ion, places), be destitute, destroy ...(make) waste, wonder.

There are 136 verses referring the word "desolate." Here are a few.

**Isa 13:9** Behold, the day of the LORD cometh, cruel both with wrath and fierce anger, to lay the land **desolate**: and he shall destroy the sinners thereof out of it.

- **Isa 13:22** And the wild beasts of the islands shall *cry* in their **desolate** houses *(cry was added in These are the Scorpions inhabiting their houses their reward)*, and dragons in their pleasant palaces *(Serpents)*: and her time *(Multitude)* is near to come, <u>and her days shall not be prolonged</u>.(days are shortened)
- **Isa 24:6** Therefore hath the curse devoured the earth, and they that dwell therein are **desolate** (*Multitude*): therefore the inhabitants of the earth are burned (*Serpents and Scorpions*), **and few men left**.(*Few men* = 144,000)
- **Jer 9:11** And I will make Jerusalem heaps, and a den of dragons (*Serpents*); and I will make the cities of Judah **desolate**, without an inhabitant.
- **Jer 50:13** Because of the wrath of the LORD it shall not be inhabited, but it shall be wholly **desolate**: every one that goeth by Babylon shall be astonished, and hiss at all her plagues.
- **Eze 15:8** And I will make the land **desolate**, because they have committed a trespass, saith the Lord GOD.
- There are 52 verses referring the word "desolation" Here are a few.
- **Pr 1:27** When your fear cometh as **desolation**, and your destruction cometh as a whirlwind *(Tribulation)*; when distress and anguish cometh upon you.
- **Isa 47:11** Therefore shall evil come upon thee; thou shalt not know from whence it riseth: and mischief shall fall upon thee; thou shalt not be able to put it off: and **desolation** shall come upon thee suddenly, which thou shalt not know.
- **Jer 51:29** And the land shall tremble and sorrow: for every purpose of the LORD shall be performed against Babylon, to make the land of Babylon a **desolation** without an inhabitant.
- Da 8:13 Then I heard one saint speaking, and another saint said unto that certain saint which spake, How long shall be the vision concerning the daily sacrifice, and the transgression of **desolation**, to give both the sanctuary and the host to be trodden under foot? --- (Lu 21:24 And they shall fall by the edge of the sword, and shall be led away captive into all nations: <u>and Jerusalem shall be [trodden down] of the Gentiles</u>, until the times of the Gentiles be fulfilled.)

- **Zep 1:13** Therefore their goods shall become a booty, and their houses a **desolation**: they shall also build houses, (*Days of Lot they builded*) but not inhabit them; and they shall plant vineyards (*Days of Lot they sowed*), but not drink the wine thereof.
- **Zep 1:15** That day is a day of wrath, a day of trouble and distress, a day of wasteness and **desolation**, a day of darkness and gloominess, a day of clouds and thick darkness,
- Lu 11:17 But he, knowing their thoughts, said unto them, Every kingdom divided against itself is brought to desolation; and a house divided against a house falleth.
- **Da 12:11** And from the time *that* the daily *sacrifice* shall be taken away, and the abomination that maketh desolate <u>set up</u>, *there shall be* a thousand two hundred and ninety days.

- **Re 13:12** And he exerciseth all the power of the first beast before him, and causeth the earth and them which dwell therein to worship the first beast, **whose deadly wound** was healed.
- **Da 12:11** And from the time *that* the <u>daily</u> sacrifice shall be <u>taken away</u>, and the abomination that maketh desolate set up, *there shall be* a thousand two hundred and ninety days.

**Daily:** 08548 tamiyd, taw-meed' from an unused root meaning to stretch; properly, continuance (as indefinite extension); but used only (attributively as adjective) constant (or adverbially, constantly); ellipt. the regular (daily) sacrifice..., continual (employment, -ly), daily, ((n-))ever(-more), perpetual.

**Taken away:** 05493 suwr ...{soor}; a primitive root; to turn off (literal or figurative):--be(-head), ...pluck away, put (away, down)...remove (to and fro)...take (away...)... withdraw, be without.(The Multitude are taken away and beheaded)

Re 20:4 And I saw thrones, and they sat upon them, and judgment was given unto them: and I saw the souls of them that were beheaded for the witness of Jesus, and for the word of God, and which had not worshipped the beast, neither his image,

neither had received his mark upon their foreheads, or in their hands; and they lived and reigned with Christ a thousand years. (The Multitude are beheaded, they don't worship the beast nor receive his mark)

Lu 21:20-22 And when ye shall see Jerusalem compassed with armies, then know that the desolation thereof is nigh. Then let them which are in Judaea flee to the mountains; and let them which are in the midst of it depart out; and let not them that are in the countries enter thereinto. For these be the days of vengeance, that all things which are written may be fulfilled.

**Eze 5:5** Thus saith the Lord GOD; **This is Jerusalem**: I have set it in the midst of the nations and countries that are round about her.

This verse that tells us "This is Jerusalem" is located in Ezekiel 5:5 where just prior to this verse Ezekiel cuts off his hair and beard, takes a remnant and tucks it away in his skirt and then divides the rest of the hair into thirds. The remnant tucked away is the 144,000. The hair that is divided into thirds are the Serpents, Scorpions, and Multitude. Then verse 5 states that the remnant and the thirds that are divided <u>are Jerusalem</u>.

**Armies:** 4760 stratopedon, strat-op'-ed-on from the base of 4756 and the same as 3977; **a camping-ground**, i.e. (by implication) **a body of troops**:--army.

Didn't we see a city that was encompassed with troops and still is? What were they gathered around the city for? The inauguration.
